# Regional Food Bank

The Regional Food Bank was created by a group of food pantry coordinators and antihunger advocates in 1982. Now in operation for 42 years its mission is to lead a network of partners to alleviate hunger, prevent food waste, and nourish communities so that people have the nutritious food needed to thrive. Foods are collected from the food industry and distributed nearly 900 to charitable agencies throughout 23 counties in the northeast. The food provided helps to feed over 350,000 people monthly. In 2022 more than 45 million pounds of were distributed food neighbors in need.

#### **Update on FEASST-**

FEASST is a formal partnership of agencies and faith-based communities in southern Saratoga County who are willing and able to financially assist residents as they struggle to make ends meet due to lack of funds for rent, utilities and other issues. FEASST originated due to the need for a structure to better organize communication contributions for organizations involved.

The 2023 non-profit members were CAPTAIN Community Human Services and Catholic Charities -SWWC. The 2023 faith-based communities included Corpus Christi Church, St. Edward the Confessor. Shenendehowa United Methodist, Grace Chapel of Clifton Park, Clifton Park Center Baptist, St. George's Episcopal, The Church at Newtown Road. Marv's Crescent Jonesville United Methodist. The total amount donated in 2023 was \$48,111. Non-profit members gave \$12,727 and faith members donated \$35,384. The total households served
